FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

WHAT IS A DRAW DOWN DINNER?

The simple answer? A ton of fun, a load of laughs, great food and a fantastic time with friends!

The official answer? A draw down dinner is a fund raiser that uses a reverse raffle (sometime known as a “last man standing” raffle) to award a grand prize.

What Does My Ticket Get Me?

Your ticket price includes one ticket entry into the \$10,000 drawing, an exquisite buffet dinner featuring beef and pork tenderloin, seafood, house wine and beer sponsored by Hardwood Floors of Lancaster. There will also be access to a silent auction and loads of laughs and fun!

You do not need to be a member to attend. We encourage you to reach out to your friends and family to join the fun.

How Does The Drawing Work?

Numbered balls that correspond with each ticket are randomly drawn, and the number of potential winners decreases with each number drawn. A team of three “monitors” will record the order of the balls that are drawn.

#1 Ball Raffle Tickets

As the balls are drawn, the ticket holder of every 25th ball drawn will be awarded three tickets for entry into the drawing for the #1 ball. Tickets for the #1 ball will also be sold throughout the evening for \$10 each or 3 tickets for \$25.

Proxies

You do not need to be present to win, but why wouldn't you want to be?? If you purchase a ticket and can not attend you must designate a "proxy" who will be attending the event to represent you.

Final Drawing

When 9 numbers remain on the board, these ticket holders will be invited to the stage. At this time, the "ticket recorder" will verify that the names remaining in the barrel are the names of the ticket holders who are on stage. The #1 ball will then be raffled off and all ten finalists will assemble on the stage.

If all ticket holders (or their proxies) for the remaining tickets in the cage are on stage, then the ticket holders are asked if they wish to split the prize or continue the drawing. If any person(s) is not in agreement to split the \$10,000, then the drawing continues until all ticket holders agree to split or until the last ticket is drawn. Throughout this process, any of the remaining winners are free to sell their ticket to a member of the audience.

If the ticket holders agree to split, then the number of ticket holders remaining will evenly split the \$10,000 prize.
